King Tide Walk

at Famosa Slough

Friends of Famosa Slough invites you to hear Jim Peugh, Chairman of the Friends of Famosa Slough, discuss the history of Famosa Slough, the design and flow of the Famosa Slough, and how sea level rise may affect the Famosa Slough.

King Tides are the highest tides of the year, and this one will be +7 feet. The high tides give us a look at what the wetland might look like in coming years as sea level rises. As the Famosa Slough gets tidal flow from the ocean via the San Diego River, the highest water levels are present about 2 to 3 hours after the high tide at the coastline.
